Citrus 'Minneola'

Description:

A hybrid selection that is a cross of a tangerine and grapefruit; large, deep reddish-orange fruit with orange flesh are tangy, juicy, and easy to peel; fruit is characterized by its stem neck; a great container plant for the patio or bright indoor areas

Features & Attributes

Minneola Tangelo features showy clusters of fragrant white star-shaped flowers with buttery yellow eyes at the ends of the branches from early to mid spring. Its glossy pointy leaves remain dark green in color throughout the year. The large orange oblong fruit is edible and has a tangy taste with a juicy texture and a strong fragrance. Note that in general, it can be difficult to get plants to reliably produce fruit indoors; this may be a challenge best reserved for adventurous and experienced gardeners.

This is a multi-stemmed evergreen houseplant with an upright spreading habit of growth. This plant may benefit from an occasional pruning to look its best.

Planting & Growing

When grown indoors, Minneola Tangelo can be expected to grow to be about 7 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 6 feet. It grows at a medium rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 50 years. This houseplant will do well in a location that gets either direct or indirect sunlight, although it will usually require a more brightly-lit environment than what artificial indoor lighting alone can provide. It does best in average to evenly moist soil, but will not tolerate standing water. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It is not particular as to soil pH, but grows best in rich soil. Contact the store for specific recommendations on pre-mixed potting soil for this plant.
